**Brian Feldman PhD**

is a certified child, adolescent and adult Jungian psychoanalyst (IAAP), an infant observation seminar leader (AIDOB), and an organizational consultant (ISPSO). He holds visiting professorships at the State University of Humanitarian Sciences in Moscow, the City University of Macau, and the University of Dakar Medical School's program in infant observation. He is a training analyst for the IRSJA, a faculty member of the SFJI, and IAAP liaison person for Macau's developing group in analytical psychology. He is a licensed clinical psychologist with a Ph.D from U.C. Berkeley and served as the chief psychologist in the Department of Child Psychology at Stanford Medical Center where he was honored with the outstanding teaching award. He has published and taught in the USA, Europe, Asia, Africa, and Latin America. .

This weekend seminar will focus on working with dreams, images, and play (including sandplay) in the context of child, adolescent and adult Jungian psychoanalysis. The first part of the seminar will focus upon both the classical Jungian texts on dreams and active imagination as contemporary views on dreams and the use of symbolic material in analysis. Material from Jung's Collected Works will be discussed as well as his seminal three volume seminars on dreams that have been published in *Dream Analysis*, *Children's Dreams*, and *Dream Interpretation: Ancient and Modern*. Jung's work with images and active imagination will be viewed through the lens of his Vision Seminars. Later elaborations of Jung's theories will be discussed from developmental and archetypal perspectives. Clinical material will be presented from child, adolescent and adult analyses to demonstrate the usefulness of the theoretical material for analytical practice.

Problems related to the use of symbolic material in analysis will also be discussed. A particular focus will be directed at the use of symbolic material in the treatment of early trauma and its impact upon the developing psyche. The development of the psychic skin in infancy as the first container of symbolic/emotional experience will be demonstrated through the use of infant observation videos. The importance of contemporary infant research, attachment theory, and infant observation upon the practice of contemporary Jungian psychoanalysis will be explored as it relates to the use of symbolic material in analysis. Clinical issues that arise in the treatment of autism spectrum disorders, eating disorders and sexual identity issues in childhood, adolescence and adulthood will also be discussed.

The participants in the seminar will have a chance to present their own clinical material to help expand upon the usefulness of Jungian and post-Jungian theory for clinical practice.
